Our society was formed in 1961 by 12 keen local gardeners to foster gardening interests in Belbroughton and district and to promote an annual flower & vegetable show each year. We also hold monthly meetings with talks and demonstrations along with a members monthly show. In April we hold a joint meeting with our friends and neighbours Clent Garden Club. Visitors are very welcome at any of our meetings which are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of the month at 7:30pm (Unless otherwise stated). Details are advertised in the parish news and on the Belbroughton noticeboard in the village.

## Rules

1. Exhibitors in the closed classes 1 to 35 must only show produce grown by themselves on their own ground. For classes 33 & 34, the exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been in their possession for at least 2 months. By signing the entry form you agree to abide by all the rules.
2. For any breach of any rule an exhibitor will be disqualified from all classes.
3. Members of Belbroughton Horticultural Society who do not reside within the parish may also exhibit in the closed classes 1 to 35 provided that they have attended not less than 6 monthly meetings during the current year.
4. A professional gardener or a person employing a professional gardener (full or part time) regular full time or part time gardener will not be eligible to show in the closed classes. Occasional casual help is accepted.
5. Entries may be delivered to the show secretary on the day of the show before 11:45pm. Late entries after 11.45pm will only be accepted with the agreement of the show secretary and will be charged 50p
6. Staging must be completed by 12:30pm on the day of the show. Staging starts at 10.30am. Judging starts at 12.45pm.
7. In the event of a shortage of display space, exhibitors must not move exhibits staged by others. Please ask the show secretary or a steward for assistance.
8. Exhibits not for sale should be removed between 4:00pm and 4:15pm when those remaining will be sold at auction for society funds. Prize cards and exhibits must NOT be removed before 4:00pm under any circumstances.
9. The judges may consider an exhibit isn't up to a reasonable standard and a lower or amended prize may be awarded.
10. Disputes! In the event of an error or if you feel your entry was incorrectly judged then you may bring this to the attention of the Show Secretary. You have until 3:30pm to lodge any complaint together with a deposit of £2. The committee will then adjudicate and its decision will be final.
11. Trophies must be returned in a clean condition. You may hand them back to the Show Secretary before 12:00pm on the morning of the show.
12. Whilst the committee will exercise every possible care, they cannot be held liable for any loss or damage to any exhibits or property.

## Victoria Sponge Recipe For Class 68

### Ingredients

175g (6oz) Butter  
175g (6oz) Caster sugar  
3 Large eggs beaten  
175g (6oz) Self raising flour  
Pinch of salt  
3 tbsp Raspberry Jam  
1 tbsp Caster sugar or icing sugar for dusting

### Method

Preheat oven to (180c fan 180c/350f/gas mark 4)

Grease two 20cm-8inch sponge tins and line with grease proof paper or baking paper.

Cream the butter and sugar together using a wooden spoon until mixture is pale in colour and light and fluffy.

Add the eggs a little at a time, beating well after each addition.

Sift flour and salt together and carefully add to the mixture, folding in with a metal spoon or spatula. Divide the mixture between the tins and smooth over.

Place them on the same shelf in the centre of the oven. Bake for 25-30 minutes until well risen, golden brown and beginning to shrink from the sides of the tin. Remove from the oven and leave to stand for 1 minute.

Loosen the cake from around the edges of the tin, turn the cakes out onto a clean tea towel, remove the paper and invert them onto a wire rack. This prevents the wire rack marking the top of the cakes.

When completely cool sandwich together with the jam and sprinkle with the sugar.

May I thank you all for your support and I wish everyone a happy and successful show today.

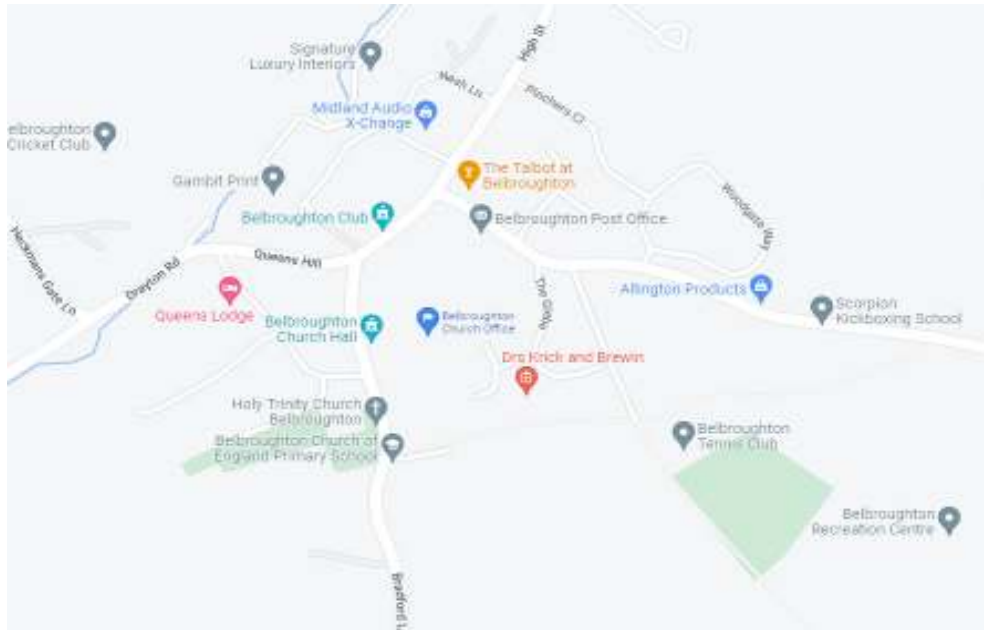
