



Reflection by Alison Lewis, LLM



In a world where we can connect with people across the globe at the click of a button, it is surprising to find that many people suffer with loneliness and isolation. However, I do not believe this is in line with God's will for our lives.

At the beginning of the Bible when God created man, God said that it was not good for man to be alone, and he decided to make him (Adam) a helper suitable for him (Genesis 2:18). We were not created to live alone.

Research shows that those who have a small circle of good friends (between three and five), live longer and are healthier, and happier than those who don't. Loneliness and isolation can increase the risk of depression, anxiety and stress.

As a Christian, therefore, it is good to know that God is omnipresent, meaning that he is everywhere all of the time. So I believe we are never really alone, even if it feels that way, even though we are unable to see God or are never aware of his presence... he is with us. He sees everything and knows all things. There is no escape!

Now it is wonderful to have friends of course, and since becoming a Christian, God has given me some of the best friends I have ever known. Being followers of Christ means we have an instant connection and are like-minded. In the Bible it says 'How can two walk together unless they agree' (Amos 3:3). It is much better if you are accompanied in life by someone who you can relate to and with whom you share interests.

However, there are times when we need to have our own space. Having three children and now six grandchildren, my house is very often a busy place. I suppose having a lot of family time, means I appreciate the quiet space when they have all left. When Jesus walked on the earth, he was constantly followed about by crowds, which was great... so many people were keen to hear his teaching, but he often got up early and retreated to a solitary place for a time of prayer (Mark 1:35). This time of prayer prepared and strengthened him for the busy day ahead. Jesus encouraged his followers to go into your room, shut the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, Jesus said who sees what is done in secret, will reward you (Matthew 6:6). Prayer is powerful, it changes things. My Christian friends and I, recognise that when we pray coincidences happen (we call them God-incidences). Whatever our situation, God is always waiting for us to call upon him in prayer.

We sing a hymn in church called 'What a friend we have in Jesus'. If you are able, perhaps you could look up the lyrics online. In our circle of close friends, the most important person to connect with is Jesus. Prayer connects our heart to his. In the words of the hymn, I agree 'What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer!'

On the whole, August is the holiday month, and life slows down for many people. It has a particular significance for me as I prepare to retire in the autumn, hoping that slowing down might become something of a more regular feature of my life. People keep telling me that I'll never know how I found the time to work. Others ask me what I am going to do, and what plans I might have. All of which are good questions and, no doubt, shrewd observations, but also rather alarming for someone like me who was thinking retirement might be about having a rest and a bit of space to do what you like!

There is a time for doing lots of things, and, I believe, there is a time for doing nothing – though clearly not, in the latter case, as a full-time activity or lack of activity. We need the stimulation of people, places and events. However, in a hectic world where we are so often measured by what we do or achieve, by our successes and achievements, it is perhaps good from time to time to learn simply to be.

How often do we ask someone on meeting them for the first time, 'well, what do you do then?', as if this is the most important thing about anyone. I know it is harder to ask 'who are you?' or 'what excites you in life?' Yet the story of who we are is so much bigger than what we do for a living. Perhaps this is something we can learn from those who are retired.


We carry this over into our prayer life as well, which so often can become very busy and wordy. It was Rowan Williams, a former archbishop, who described prayer as akin to sunbathing. You don't actually do very much, but wallow in the warm rays of God's love. By the way, I can't actually imagine this particular archbishop sun-bathing - and yet, I do like the image of prayer being about us simply soaking up God's love. Maybe that is something for which I might find more time in retirement.

What is or will be happening in Blakedown Church during the next few months.

A new form of electrical heating to replace the gas boiler, will, we hope be installed by the Autumn. This will help the church become carbon neutral. The gas meter has already been removed, and we await removal of the old gas boiler which had a habit of letting us down in the cold weather!

The path at the front door, along by the west wall, and back door of the church, will be undergoing remedial work. Unfortunately, we have damp inside the building causing plaster to fall, this is due to lack of correct drainage facilities outside. The work will take 7 to 10 days to complete. A notice will be pinned to the Birmingham Road gate to advise when the path will be closed, and therefore ask that if you normally use this path to Blue Hoots Preschool, please use the driveways for access instead of the path for your personal safety. Thank you.

Thirdly, permission is being sought from Worcester Diocese to start the roof repairs, for which so many villagers and parishioners have donated money for 'tiles'. We hope to renew the Chancel Roof before Christmas, which is at the East end of the building. Just for information, this relatively small area of roof will need 3778 tiles! If you have supported this work please look out for information on notice boards, church web site, or Broadcast, regarding 'signing' of tiles prior to them being fitted on the roof.

The PCC is very grateful for the support received for the urgent repairs that our Victorian, listed church requires, and apart from the fundraising, we must acknowledge our gratitude to the late Marilyn Hiscock of Brookside Way, whose very generous legacy has enabled this work to go ahead at this time. Apologies for any inconvenience caused while the work is in hand, which will commence once we have the necessary permission from Worcester Diocese. The church will remain open daily while the work is in progress.



Matthew 23 - A Warning Against Hypocrisy

Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: "The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. So you must be careful to do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach. They tie up heavy, cumbersome loads and put them on other people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them.

"Everything they do is done for people to see: They make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long; they love the place of honour at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; they love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to be called 'Rabbi' by others.

"But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers. And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one Instructor, the Messiah. The greatest among you will be your servant. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

Information about other local churches: This month it's Upper Arley

St Peter's, Upper Arley

St Peter's, Upper Arley; part of the church dates to the 1100s, with a Victorian extended chancel, vestry and porch. A new kitchen and toilet extension were added in 2005/6. The building is grade 2 listed and seats around 180 -200 people. It is built of local stone and has many attractive features; the church is open every day.

There is a churchyard which is still open, but getting close to being full. Therefore full burials are restricted to the residents of Arley and Shatterford unless in an existing family grave; interment of ashes is treated more flexibly. The civil Parish Council are looking to acquire some land from Arley Estate for a municipal cemetery which will ease the situation.

The building is in good repair having had its roof replaced two years ago with stainless steel, following lead thefts. On occasions it is used by village groups during the week if the hall has been previously booked, as well as for concerts.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Thanks to our WI members for sharing their favourites

Sweet Red Onion Tart

This rich and creamy tart is packed with red onions that have been slowly caramelised in butter. This vegetarian dish is a wonderful accompaniment or served warm with a tomato salad, crusty bread and a glass of red.

- 25g butter
- 2 red onions thinly sliced
- 1 large white onion, finely chopped
- 375g ready rolled shortcrust pastry
- 330ml low fat creme fraiche
- 3 medium eggs
- pinch of nutmeg
- 150g emmental, grated
- 15g fresh chives chopped (save a little to garnish)



Melt butter in a large pan. Add all the onions and season, then cover and cook slowly for 30-40mins, stirring occasionally until the onions are soft and starting to caramelise. Then remove from heat and allow to cool slightly.

Preheat oven to 190 C, gas 5. Roll out pastry and line 20x30cm rectangular loose bottom tin, or similar. Line with baking parchment and fill with baking beans and bake blind for 15mins, lift out the paper and beans and bake for a further 5mins.

Place creme fraiche, eggs, nutmeg and chives in a large bowl. Season with black pepper and whisk together. Stir in caramelised onions and half the cheese, and pour over the pastry case. Scatter the remaining cheese over the top.

Bake for 30mins until the surface is golden and filling set. Allow to stand for 5mins then garnish with a few chives and enjoy.

AUGUST IN THE GARDEN

August is usually one of the hottest months of the year - making watering essential. Try to use grey water wherever possible, especially as water butts may be running low if it has been a dry summer. August is traditionally holiday-time, so you might need to enlist the help of friends and family to look after the garden while you are away. When you are at home, take the time to prune summer-flowering shrubs.

- Prune Wisteria 1.
- Don't delay summer pruning fruits trained as restricted forms 2.
- Deadhead flowering plants regularly 3.
- Watering! Particularly containers, and new plants, preferably with grey recycled water or stored rainwater
- Collect seed from garden plants 5.
- Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready 6.
- Continue cutting out old fruited canes on raspberries 7.
- 8. Lift and pot up rooted strawberry runners
- 9. Keep ponds and water features topped up
- Feed the soil with green manures 10.


U3A is run by volunteers on a local basis. No qualifications are required to attend modules and there are no exams. Members help each other to learn - for pleasure and to stay alert!






